

Best for: real novelty

Genuine back to nature stuff; Amalinda is carved out of the Matobos boulders. Staying in: The lodge meanders through those boulders, with dining and other public rooms on various levels, hidden among the branches and the rocks. Suites are essentially luxurious semi-caves you'll be loathe to leave.

Going out: Matobos is back in the limelight, that otherworldly, granite landscape that is home to ancient art, Cecil John Rhodes' grave and a park full of game. Self drive, ride or go by Land Rover. Book it: From US\$484 per


Cape Town Best for: health and
